Couple questions....

Refuse/Garbage PSA8160-12024 Adopted Budget \$26,46522 hrs @ \$20.36 x 52weeks= \$23291.84(extra \$3173.16 - > 7 weeks of salary-yet out of money early October)

Refuse/Garbage PS-2 A8160.12 \$21,548 22 hrs @ \$18.25 x 52 weeks= \$20878.00 (extra \$670.00)

Who supervises the Recycling Center Superintendent? Who approves all the extra hours billed before they come up annually as a several thousand dollar budget adjustment after they were paid out?

That is why a board member shouldn't be in a position in which the board oversees. Clearly a conflict of interest as reflected by the hours billed the town (taxpayer money).

At the October 17,2024 meeting it was stated that the A8160-1 position worked 32 hours per week. 32 hrs \times \$20.36 \times 5 pay weeks in Oct '24 = \$3257.60 yet \$4338.16 was paid. (42.61 hours/week)

A8160.12 22 hrs x \$18.25 x 5 weeks = \$2007.50 Paid amount \$2135.25 (23.4 hrs/week)

Adding 5 hours to the dump hours didn't correct the over budget issue, it worsened it. The extra 10 hours claimed as picking up trash after events are questionable. The income from the landfill does not justify the salaries/hours being paid. Fewer hours at the landfill would help in keeping the losses (over \$100,000 in the red past two years) down. Seventeen hours were sufficient for many years. The revenue didn't increase with the additional hours. I understood the elimination of one part time employee in the tentative budget to be a cost saving measure, not an \$11,535 increase for the remaining employee.

Now that the hours have been moved to Buildings-PS it is a \$13,000 increase. I am guessing that the \$1060.90 spent on code A1620.1 was for the cleaner, so what was the need to increase the \$3000 to \$5000 in the tentative 2025 budget?

Wouldn't it be more prudent to advertise for a maintenance man as opposed to awarding a third job to a current two job holder? His over budget amount would pay the Youth Director, Code Enforcement and Animal Control Officer.

Stony Creek pays the maintenance man \$19.36/hour. The budget adjustment at the November 14, 2024 meeting to increase Buildings-PS \$10,500 for 2024 is also questionable.

I realize everyone is laser focused on the new highway garage, but there doesn't seem to be any effort to save any money for it to defray the cost to the taxpayer, as evidenced by the NYClass Account entitled Highway-Garage, as specified in the January 24,2023 resolution establishing a Fund Balance Policy, which set aside money for that intended purpose that now cannot be used for that intended purpose. How did that happen?

C&D still will need to be closed by April 4, 2032, possibly at hundreds of thousands more than being budgeted for. The road I live on still needs to be repaired, as do others per the 2023 Hazard Mitigation Plan.

I seriously worry what this town will look like a few years down the road with the debt you are willing to incur.

Posting the revised preliminary budget online 49 minutes before the Budget Hearing was held on November 7, 2024 was a great disservice to Thurman taxpayers. There was not one line item that would have made the (not approved at that time) Union Contract known to the public. It should have been available along with the Notice of Public Hearing .

Who represents the interest of the Thurman taxpayer?
